

# THE EUROPEAN POLICIES OF THE EU MEMBER-STATES

## COURSE RULES

*Registration on the course means the student has accepted and agrees to respect the rules of the game, as laid out below.*

The course is addressed to students who:

- Want to undertake an individual research project (term paper)
- Will participate systematically in the course and attend all classes

If these conditions do not apply, it is not recommended to enrol in this course.

### Student Obligations / Grading

- A written term paper (essay) of 3,500-4,000 words MAXIMUM. The essay is a case study of the European policy of a selected EU member-state. The country is chosen in collaboration with the professor. Term papers whose topic has not been approved by the professor will not be accepted.
- A short in-class oral presentation of your chosen country.
- Active participation in the class throughout the semester.
- A final oral examination on your term paper and the European policy of your chosen country. Only students who have made a presentation in class will be eligible to take part in the final examination.

All the above 4 elements (presentation, paper, participation and final oral examination) will be taken into account in the final grade.

### Language

- The language of instruction in this course is English, meaning not only classes but also all oral presentations, term papers and oral exams are in English.

### Enrolment in the Course

Apart from the official enrolment in the course (Departmental Secretariat or Erasmus office), the student should also declare her/his participation to the professor.

This should be done by e-mail to [sverney@pspa.uoa.gr](mailto:sverney@pspa.uoa.gr) stating:

- Student's name
- E-mail address

- University (Erasmus students) or registration number (A.M.) for University of Athens students
- Your chosen country with 2 alternative choices.

### Plagiarism
