Mother and daughter were reunited 4 years later totally by coincidence in **Malatya**...

I was raised by both of them... I miss them every single day since they are gone... and I wish I was able to talk more but they usually refused to talk about genocide...I did not insist, I could see it was hurting them...

Rest in peace...you are gone but never forgotten...
